How Did the Community Solar Projects Fare this Winter? >>>

It's spring and most of us are saying 'Bring on the sun'. 'Warm up the earth'. Community Solar shareholders are saying 'Bring on the solar energy production'.

This winter, our region and much of the State received an unusual amount of snow from early in the season, which affected the output of the solar panels this year. However, as we look forward to spring, we're already seeing outputs increase at more than double what we were able to generate in January and February.

Our first community solar project was commissioned in the spring of 2017 at our Crow Wing Power headquarters. All shares in the first project were sold out within just a little over half a year.

Therefore, in 2018, we commissioned a second project located at our Swanburg Outpost center east of Pine River. Out of 111 shares available in that project, members have since subscribed to 90 shares, leaving 21 shares available.

Shareholders have been receiving the anticipated \$4.00 to \$4.50 per month

return on their investment. Life of the projects were predicted at 20 years, which included applicable replacement parts, maintenance, insurance, etc.

The purchase price for the 2018 project was at \$1300 per share. Now with an 18-year life remaining, the 2020 price is \$1170 per share to coincide with the reduced life. For more information go to our website at cwpower.com and click on Environment to access the community solar projects.

A WORD FROM YOUR CEO Preparing for Events that Could Impact Electric Service Coronavirus Plans Underway >>>

As an electric distribution cooperative, Crow Wing Power is depended upon to bring reliable electricity to 38,000 members and their families and businesses who rely on electricity for their daily lives.

Therefore in preparation for a potential Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak in our region, we are updating our Emergency Restoration Plan to include detailed activities related to varying levels of risk associated with the latest COVID - 19.

Since 2004, Crow Wing Power has diligently practiced and implemented a nationwide practice of preparing for disasters or situations that could impact our ability to provide essential services.

Our current plan, documented and practiced annually by key staff, addresses what we would do in case of fire/smoke, medical emergencies, severe weather, bomb threats, hostage/holdup/robbery/active shooter incidents, customer conflict, major power outages, HVAC failures, internal floods, chemical/biological threats, nuclear situations, facilities failures, pandemic influenza and now Coronavirus. Minimally, we've extended recommended practices to employees as outlined and recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and World Health Organizations on preventative measures employees can take.

Employees are being asked to follow hand washing and sanitizing methods. If employees are sick, they are asked to stay home, so as not to spread any kind of illness.

Business travel is being limited and Webinar training will be the suggested norm for the time being.

Depending upon the level of threat to employees and members, various steps will be taken to insure we have a work force that can adequately serve our members, which may include key employees working remotely from home or at other locations. And, like many essential service providers, we closed our lobby to the public on March 19th for social distancing measures.

As things progress, we will have updated actions and plans posted on our website.

Clogged coils, low refrigerant levels, plugged drain lines and a host of minor problems can greatly affect the efficiency of your central air conditioner. To help you save energy, we're offering a limited number of \$25 rebates to residential members that get a tune-up. Rebates are limited, therefore it's best to contact us first to make sure we still have them available.

On order to qualify, you need to have a certified HVAC contractor do the work. AC must be placed into service prior to Dec. 31, 2017 with no utility reimbursed tune ups within the last two years.

We have a strict policy about protecting members' privacy.

The group's initial email reiterates the same issues the group had last year and nothing has changed. They reached out to the State Attorney General's office for a forensic audit over a year ago and are claiming there is 'litigation' by the Federal and State Attorney General Offices. We are not aware of any pending litigation.

We have nothing to hide, have done nothing wrong and welcome the review.

This is a well-run Cooperative with honest-hard working employees and management that truly care about the members we serve. 
Electric Bill - New Simplified Look - Same Billing Structure >>>


