A WORD FROM YOUR CEO

Grid-Connected Solar Systems Numbers Are Increasing >>>

Summer is here in full swing, new service builds are active and we're seeing an uptake in solar applications and installations in our service area. It's possible solar interest is just naturally increasing, however it's highly likely the recent boost in government tax credits and incentives may be playing a large role in that development.

At the time this article is written, we have 130 systems connected. Three years ago, we had 11 renewable energy systems hook up to our grid; two years ago, that number increased to 16; last year, 20 were connected; and this year, we've commissioned 13 thus far with another 20 applications in the queue. The great majority are residential with two churches preparing to connect at this time.

The number of renewable energy systems reflected here, are only systems that apply to connect to our grid.

Luke Christensen is one of the member service representative who works with members who want to install grid-connected solar systems. According to Luke, the majority of applications are coming from the baby boomer generation in particular.

Every grid connected system that gets installed goes through a thorough inspection

process by Luke and one of our electricians before it is commissioned.

The federal Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), passed into law last fall, is loaded with incentives for energy efficiencies and clean energy initiatives. Federal tax credits of 30% or more are easily attainable for renewable energy systems, according to Luke. Note that those incentives could also be drawing added sales reps and installers to the area, so it's recommended to look for local contractors, get several bids and seek out testimonials that are reliable.

Our newly redesigned website has great detailed information and links to third party unbiased resources like Clean Energy Resource Teams (CERTS) to help homeowners.

On page three of this newsletter there are some figures about costs, and other frequently asked questions about solar systems.

Three Board Incumbents Re-Elected >>>



The 2023 Annual Business Meeting for the Cooperative was held on Saturday, June 17 at Arrowwood Lodge in Baxter. The annual meeting is the culmination of the board results from the 2023 election.

A total of 5,594 ballots were cast in this year's election – 5,065 through mail-in voting and 529 electronically. The number of members voting online is still only 10%, but this is only our second year offering it.

In District 1 At-Large, incumbent Bryan McCulloch was elected with 2,458 votes over, Lance Bragstad with 1,179 votes, Lee Midthun with 1,063 votes and Michael Rancour with 843 votes. Incumbent Gert Roggenkamp was elected as District 2B Director with 2,585 votes over Thomas Lillehei with 1,718 votes and Gary Bakken with 1,239 votes.

In District 3A, incumbent Dwight Thiesse was elected with 2,947 votes over Loren Beilke who received 2,582 votes.

Members and guests of Crow Wing Power listened to updates from the Cooperative's leadership team. Bruce Kraemer, CEO; Eric Quale, COO; and Susannah Jensen, CFO reflected on last year's financial highlights.

Social Media Sparks Conversations about Solar Power >>>

Crow Wing Power is igniting a conversation about solar power in Minnesota this summer. Taking to social media, we've asked members about their questions, unique uses of solar power, and even shared trivia about community solar. The response has been eye opening, with people showing a keen interest in learning more about solar power.

The redesigned cwpower.com now offers a comprehensive renewables page that can answer many of your questions. Simply visit cwpower.com/renewables for more information.

Here are a few frequently asked questions (FAQs) that members often have about solar power: (*Facts and figures here reflect what we see in our service area.*)

What is the average cost of a solar system?

The average cost is \$4,500 per kW without battery storage, before any incentives or credits. For example, a 10kW system would cost approximately \$45,000.

Prices typically range from \$2,500 to \$6,500 per kW.

What is the average size of a solar system?

The average size of a system connected to our grid is 12kW.

What does Crow Wing Power pay for energy put back (buy back) on the grid (Net Metering) in 2023? Residential members receive a rate of .113/kWh. Small commercial members receive a rate of .112/kWh. Large commercial members receive a rate of .054/kWh.



How much power do solar panels provide?

The power output depends on the panel's rating, but on average, panels generate 300-450 watts per panel.

How much can you save per month?

Monthly savings vary depending on the system. A great resource for estimating savings is pvwatts.nrel.gov.

On average, how long does it take for the system to "pay for itself" in energy savings?

Systems that benefit from the federal tax credit typically recoup their cost in approximately 11 to 15 years.

Solar Power Beyond Buildings

While solar power may not be suitable for every home or business, Crow Wing Power encourages members to think creatively about how they can harness the sun's energy. Members have shared various innovative uses for solar power, such as charging dock lifts, trolling motor batteries, cell phones, outdoor lighting, electric fences, and even electric vehicles.

If you're unable to utilize solar power on a smaller scale or install a solar system, Crow Wing Power has you covered. We have built three Community Solar arrays. The Phase III array, commissioned in April 2022, still has shares available. Cooperative members can purchase solar share production credits and receive credit on their monthly electric bills based on their share of the electricity produced (an average of \$5 credit per month per share).
